MEDICA showcases Florida companies to more than 130,000 visitors from 120 countries

ORLANDO, FL – Today, Enterprise Florida (EFI) President & CEO, Gray Swoope announced EFI will host the Florida pavilion at MEDICA 2013, showcasing nearly 25 small and mid-sized Florida companies and organizations marketing their medical and healthcare products to an international audience. MEDICA is the largest medical trade fair worldwide and will be held in Germany on November 20-23. The 2013 Florida Pavilion will be the largest U.S. state pavilion and its first-ever two-story pavilion, demonstrating the innovation and expertise that makes the state a leader in the life sciences sector.
